War with Persia

- Persia = Present day Middle East; largest (and very powerful) empire at the time wanted to expand west (towards Ancient Greece)
- 499 BC Athens sent soldiers to help city states on the eastern side of the Aegean Sea (Ionians) against a Persian invasion; at first worked, but Athens removed their support to fast; Persia crushed the Ionians and wanted to punish Athens for initially helping
- 490 BC Battle of Marathon Persia attacked Athens; Athens flanked Persian army and won, a stunning victory
- 480 BC Battle of Thermopylae Persia (180,000 soldiers) attacked Greek city states that joined together (mostly Athenians and Spartans 6,000 to 7,000 soldiers); "300" Spartans held their ground to allow other Greeks to escape; Persian victory overran mainland and burned Athens
- Month later Greeks defeated the Persians at the Battle of Salamis (sea battle)
- 479 BC Battle of Plataea Persians attacked; Sparta and Athens worked together to defeat Persia

Summary:

- -Mountains encouraged the development of city-states
- -Competition between city-states made the city-states weak against external threats
- -City-states had to work together (unity equals strength)
- -Athens had to rebuild they will rebuild, and become the strongest citystate in the region
